ABOUT THE POEM & AUTHOR

Colleen E. Kennedy created "Sonnet" from the *Elegiac Sonnets* of Charlotte Smith (1784). About the poem and the process of composing it, Colleen writes:

Turning to several of the sonnets of the 18th century Charlotte Smith, a major influence on the Romantic poets, who composed her *Elegiac Sonnets* while in debtors' prison with her husband and child, I was moved by her sensuous landscapes. I intertwined lines from her Sonnets II, III, IV, V, and XXIII to create the 14 lines of a sonnet—not attending to meter and rhyme—a love poem to nature.

Colleen E. Kennedy teaches courses focused on the poetics of Shakespearean drama. Her work has appeared in *Shakespeare & Beyond*, *The Recipes Project: Food, Magic, Art, Science, and Medicine, Appositions: Studies in Renaissance/Early Modern Literature & Culture*, and elsewhere.
